

**RESOLUTION R2021-34**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BURNET, TEXAS, ASSIGNING A MUNICIPAL COURT ASSOCIATE JUDGE TO TEMPORARILY ACT IN THE PLACE OF THE MUNICIPAL COURT PRESIDING JUDGE UNTIL A NEW MUNICIPAL COURT PERMANENT PRESIDING JUDGE IS APPOINTED.**

**Whereas**, Section 4.03.B., of the City Charter, authorizes the city council to appoint a presiding municipal court judge for a term of two years;

**Whereas**, on this date, city council adopted a resolution accepting the presiding judges resignation and authorizing the solicitation of qualification for her replacement; and

**Whereas** the Honorable Jane Marie Hurst and Tamara Tinney, serve as associate municipal court judges; and

**Whereas**, the purpose of this resolution is to designate an municipal court associate judge to temporarily act in the place of the municipal court presiding judge until a new presiding judge is appointed.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BURNET, TEXAS, THAT:**

**Section one. Designation.** Tamara Tinney is hereby designate to temporarily act in the place of the municipal court presiding judge until a new presiding judge is appointed.

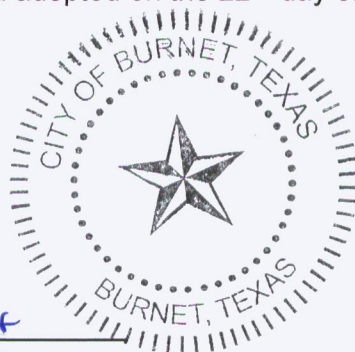
**Section two. Duties and compensation.** The associated judge designated in section one shall have the same duties and receive the same compensation as stated in that certain agreement dated March 17, 2005, by and between the city and the Honorable Peggy Simon, as same may have been amended to date.

**Section three. Designation does not create an office.** The designation established by this resolution does not create and office and the status of the designee shall always be that as an alternate judge as provided in section 4.03.E., of the city charter; and, upon the appointment of a permanent presiding judge the designation stated in this resolution shall expire.
